What we accomplished last year


- By the end of last year we demonstrated:
 - Ability to deploy more than 7 field teams simultaneously
 - We can operate indep at a field site or at a served agency
 - Run multiple nets simultaneously
 - Deploy field relay stations, including digital and voice repeaters (cross band)
 - Operate in:
 - Winlink (Packet and Pactor)
 - Digital Still Photography
 - VHF voice, HF voice
 - Streaming video
 - Coordinate multiple agencies, deploying multiple operators who have the ability to communicate and document their operations

What We are looking to accomplish this year - Nate

- Re-affirmation and reinforcement of our existing operation skills
- Recruitment and training of new operators to our current operating skillset
 - Served agencies
 - Field relay teams
- Adoption of an official still photography mode
- GIS mapping capability in the Field and net control team
 - Associated skillset in reporting data for all members and our aux comm allies



Current Membership stats

- 50 Active Members
- ▶ 30 "non-active members



Why more members

- Meet the demands created by new deployment model
- Replenish normal attrition
- Encourage new ham licensing



How many new members do we need?

- > 7 new mobile field relay teams x = 3 hams per team = 21
- 6 served agency teams x 1 new ham per team (minimum)= 6
- Let's round that to 30!

- 2500 licensed hams in Multnomah county
- ▶ 1800 on the "east" side
- 700 on the "west" side
- 2 ham radio clubs in Multnomah county
